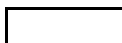

## SUBSTITUTIONS

**1) I play every game with 25 players.** There is no such thing as someone who can't be used off the bench if the right situation arises.

- LOWRIE should be used off the bench in game winning situations only.
- BAUTISTA, BELTRAN, JETER, HELTON, LeMAHIEU, SCHIERHOLTZ & SANDOVAL should only come off bench if game within 2.
- Remove BAUTISTA & BELTRAN from severe blowouts. Use R.DAVIS, HEISEY or GOSE.

**2) PINCH-HITTING:**

- Computer** - Never hit for BAUTISTA, BELTRAN, JETER, LeMAHIEU, LOWRIE & SANDOVAL. K.SUZUKI is an obvious candidate vs any pitcher to be hit for if behind late. DUDA, and usually two of the outfielders are platoon situations. I usually don't look to PH until the 7th at the earliest, but if there's a chance to break a game open in the 6th you can go for it. The lefty hitters are generally a stronger group than the righties. Favor them if it's a situation where you may counter with a pitching change. You may also look to PH for HELTON or I.DAVIS vs a lefty in the last AB. Don't do so if it's a slugging situation for Ike or you can switch back to a righty. W.CASTILLO is the designated lefty killer. There are a bevy of 1B(2)s to move in. Leave the better gloves in the game if we lead.
- Boards** - It's pretty much the same as above, with all of the platoon situations more pronounced. The one difference is that LOWRIE, LeMAHIEU & even rarely BAUTISTA enter that big shift territory vs a lefty. Last AB only. Use the "Ike" criteria above.

**3) POSITION SUMMARIES:**

- C** - Mostly a really bad K.SUZUKI card. W.RAMOS is solid when he's up. W.CASTILLO is there for lefties only and will also DH. They can be subbed for each other freely.
- 1B** - HELTON & I.DAVIS start. They only leave a game for a pinch-runner or a PH for a lefty as detailed above. (rare)
- 2B** - LOWRIE & LeMAHIEU will usually finish what they start. LOWRIE may leave for defense in a tight game.
- SS** - JETER all the way. LOWRIE fills in what's left.
- 3B** - SANDOVAL starts most games and is only removed for a pinch-runner. BAUTISTA comes in from the outfield to handle the rest and is only removed in blowouts. LOWRIE will also make some starts here.
- OF** - BAUTISTA & BELTRAN go all the way and are only removed for blowouts. SCHIERHOLTZ & DUDA from the left and R.DAVIS, HEISEY & POLLOCK from the right are platoon guys. GOSE will also show up here.
- DH** - This is a mix of overflow from the other positions. I.DAVIS, DUDA, W.CASTILLO & R.DAVIS will all see time here. Outside of Ike, its more platoon fodder.

**4) PINCH-RUNNING:**

- Run for any slow runner if they are the lead or tie run with after the 7th.
- Pinch-run to enter defensive subs where appropriate.
- The main pinch-runner is R.DAVIS again this year. GOSE will also be a fine choice when he is up. Remember that BAUTISTA can move to 3B or 1B.

**5) DEFENSIVE SUBS:**

- K.SUZUKI after the last AB for the starting C.
- Replace DUDA if playing OF with any of R.DAVIS, GOSE or HEISEY after the 7th
- LeMAHIEU at 2B and HELTON (for a 1B2 only, not for Ike) to protect a one-run lead after 7th
- If the player to be subbed for is due up the next inning, substitute after that AB.

## BASE RUNNING

JETER has lost his 3rd 31 but has 5 24s. There should be a steal or H&R whenever he bats and the game is within 3. SSN be damned!

**6) STEALING** - A player may steal any base when eligible by the Adams tables and **my** allowancw letters on page one.

R.DAVIS & GOSE can run at will. Most other attempts will come from the H&R.

- BAUTISTA, BELTRAN & JETER straight steal only after the 5th.
- Add 2 to Adams tables with BAUTISTA & I.DAVIS at bat.
- Subtract 2 from the Adams table with 0 or 1 out and JETER, LeMAHIEU & HOLT at bat.
- No one steals 3rd 'til the 6th, home 'til the 8th. All "non A's" do not straight steal with a lead of 3 or more.

**7) HIT & RUN**

- Hit & run if Adams gives the greenlight but my steal restrictions say no. Also hit & run if runner cannot steal by the Adams tables but SSN is over 24. Do not H&R 1st & 3rd, except JETER.
- JETER & LeMAHIEU hit and run whenever legal. If the base runner is R.DAVIS or GOSE look to steal if 0 or 2 out, H&R with 1 out.
- H&R with R.DAVIS, HEISEY & SANDOVAL only if SSN > 24 (SANDOVAL 0 or 1 out only)
- DO NOT H&R with HELTON, HOLT, LOWRIE, W.RAMOS or K.SUZUKI

**8) SACRIFICE**

- Consider sacrifice when down one, tied or ahead with K.SUZUKI, R.DAVIS & GOSE unless they have a large plus shift AND steal or H&R not an option.
- Also use this when a crippling negative shift needs to stay in the game for defense.
- No squeeze candidates this year. Never bunt with two strikes. Never pinch-hit to sacrifice.

### 10) REMOVE PITCHER

- STARTERS** - BEACHY will go until fatigue. The rest of the rotation will try to go 6, but if there's an uprising in the 6th go ahead and pull them. Think an inning earlier with H.ALVAREZ.
- LATE** - This the veritable bullpen by committee. I don't care who gets the save. PESTANO, GREGERSON and DOOLITTLE are the main guys in the 8th and 9th when the game is on the line. Use them situationally to set each other up and look at who's rested when you're deciding between the righties. I could even see GUERRA getting a handful of saves because of his +55 HA. As always with the Generals, using the closer in a tie game is highly encouraged! Cardboard pitchers don't have agents.
- SETUP & MIDDLE** - Go with whatever grade 12 is rested. DOOLITTLE kind of floats between this group and the late inning guys.
- LEFTIES** - I'm short on lefty innings and there'll only be one active until November. So please make sure they are facing primarily lefties and get them out after they've done that job. While DOOLITTLE will be an effective late inning option EDGIN's peripherals make him more of a middle guy.
- EARLY, MIDDLE, BULK** - C.ALLEN when he's up. When not spread it around with the 12's **except** DOOLITTLE

*My pitching instructions are intended as guidelines not rules. Pitching changes are the most difficult part of playing the road team. I will accept your judgement.*

## DEFENSIVE OPTIONS

**11) INTENTIONAL WALKS** - *If the Generals trail at anytime* , or the lead run is in scoring position after the 6th, and first base is open, intentionally walk the batter in the following circumstances:

- 1 out, men on - to set up the DP (on-deck hitter must be a DP threat) unless on-deck hitter is superior to batter.
  - 2 out, men on - to get to an inferior hitter.
- Never load the bases unless the hitter/pitcher combo makes a walk unlikely.*

**12) PITCH FROM STRETCH** - If the runner on 3rd has an adjusted SSN of 12 or more with 2 out, game within 1 run.

**13) HOLD RUNNER** - When 1B(4 or 5) is playing first always hold. Otherwise:

- Hold all fast runners.
- Hold all medium runners unless I have a lead of 2 or more and there is a PR hitter.
- Hold slow runners only with a RH hitter or less than 2 out unless I lead by 2 or more
- Don not hold with 2 out and men on 1st and 3rd unless runner on 1st is the lead or tie run.

**14) INFIELD IN**

- Play "in" with a runner on 3rd only, 1 out, tied or behind, *ANY INNING* , unless its before the 6th with 1-3 hitters up.
- Play "in" with a *lead* run on 3rd only, with 0 or 1 out after the 7th.
- Play "in" with the lead run on 3rd after the 8th, 1st base occupied and 0 out.

**15) HOLD RUNNER ON THIRD** - Hold all runners with 0 out and slow runners with 1 out.

**16) OUTFIELD THROWS**

- Throw for the lead runner anytime the trailing runner cannot advance or or the lead chance is < 25.  
**Exception: The trailing runner is the tie run with a good chance to advance after the 7th.**
- Throw home to get the lead or tie run after the 6th if there is < 36 chances. If the trail runner is the *WINNING* run and the lead runner's chance is > 32, stop the trail runner.
- On the computer game, play your best guess using common baseball strategies.

**17) RUNNER ADVANCEMENT** - Use Adams Tables. If computer, see 15(c). Go for it the text says "well around".

Don't go for optional triples unless all conditions are ideal; NOT behind by 2 or more AND plus speed AND 1 out.

**18) INJURIES** - Use logical replacement

Feel free to give me a call with any problems. Overall I will accept your good judgement. When I play my team at home I do not "count hits" etc. for my team and don't expect you to. But if you are into that aspect of the game feel free. GOOD LUCK!
