3. Pinch Hitting - Pinch hit when it matters (score close) but keep defense up if we lead. Large shifts (+\& -) mean everybody is available (except for Stanton, Dyson, Nieuwenhuis). Generally, one of Baker, Green or Petit will be available for possible ph against LHP but Paulsen is the PH most of the time (LHP and RHP).
4. Pinch Runner - for slow $8^{\text {th }}$ on, when game on line. Baker, Green, Petit or Hudson can run. No SB here best runners will be starting most of the time.
5. Defensive Substitutes - Paulsen to 1B if Francisco starting at 1B (if Paulsen ph, then consider taking out Francisco and using Green or Dyson)
6. Sacrifice; Never with Francisco, Howard, Stanton, Venable, and Viciedo. Any player not having a first column " 1 " on 66 - and often those with bad shifts even with a " 1 " to keep them in game will sac on no out, man on second or 1st and 2nd, pitcher "B" or better, score close, late. Ditto for man on first, steal not recommended (especially if adjusted pitching grade over 18). Squeeze bunt - ONLY with runners on 3rd, or 2nd and 3rd, 8th or later, score within 1, fast runner. Batter with less than 5-13's
7. Stealing 2nd: Escobar and Dyson after 3rd inning, Stanton and Kinsler after $7^{\text {th }}$, score within 2, adjusted SSN over 27. (These four could try to steal 3rd when it makes sense, 9th inning on.)
8. Hit and Run - Kinsler, Green and Baker will H\&R with man on first, or men on first and third with 0 or 2 outs. Paulsen never. Carpenter and Lucroy only when pitchers control over +36 . Others (rarely) but your call.
9. Intentional Walk: If score not close late, big hitter can walk in front of whimp on 2 out, but don't put tying/winning run on base.
10. Pitch from Stretch: On 2 out, for adjusted SSN of 12 or more; on less than 2 out, with adjusted SSN of 15 or more (or 12 if pitcher grade 20 or more).
11. Hold runner: For 1B2 never! All others - always on none or 1 out; also on 2 out unless runner won't steal.
12. Infield deep before 6th, on 2 out, if score difference 3 or more, if man on 1st too. Otherwise play in.
13. Offensive runner advancement: By Adams tables. For computer game, when obvious (runner well around bag, or on single to right, especially with runners on $1^{\text {st }}$ and 2 nd ). Consider runner's speed.
14. Outfield throws: Never if runner has $33 / 36$ or better chance of safe advance (unless this scores winning run), cutoff automatic, trailing runners hold. Otherwise throw.
15. Injuries: Your judgment but see next page. Call: (978)-687-2124 for lineup if needed, just do your best.
16. Send runner on 3 rd: On 2 out, your infield deep, or your defense below average (sum of $2 \mathrm{nd}+\mathrm{SS}+3 \mathrm{rd}$ basemen less than 19).
17. Defense against multiple steals: Pitch from stretch as appropriate. Hold ball and free steal of 2nd (no steal of home) for men on 1st and 3rd (unless \#12 applies); for runners on 1st and 2nd go for lowest SSN.

Set-up: any above $7^{\text {th }}$ or $8^{\text {th }}$ (use as needed) Betances can be stopper in $6^{\text {th }}$ if needed
Middle: any above plus Papelbon or Alburquerque $6^{\text {th }}$ or $7^{\text {th }}$ (also Vincent or Rzepczynski when available) Lefty specialist: Howell, Rzepczynski, Abad
Long: Lowest grade, MOP - Lowest grade, (may be Alburquerque)
STARTERS ARE NEVER EVER TO BE USED IN RELEIF
Starter leaves when fatigued but protect leads after 5 th. Verlander should leave after 3 runs or 5 innings. Hudson might have to be rescued before completing 5. I will have 6 or 7 relievers up any month, see active list, check email for limit on innings later in year. Better pitchers could make it to $7^{\text {th }}$. Wacha and Treinen have lower fatigue but will try to go through 5th. Then, if behind by 3 or more they may stay until pounded out but leave if GC makes comeback.

## GOTHAM CITY PHILOSPHY THIS YEAR

This is a good team in stiff competition for a playoff spot. The best line-up and relief staff are up for the 4 months I face my division. Sometimes I will keep a pinch-hitter down so I can have an extra bull-pen guy.

In Case of Injury, use this table - keep defense up.
C - Chirinos and Lucroy and they can substitute for each other (if injury requires catcher goes from dh to C then there is no dh after).
1b - Trumbo and Francisco (some Paulsen)
2b - Mostly Kinsler
SS - Escobar for 162 games.
$3 b$ - mostly Carpenter, some Petit or Green
CF - mostly Dyson, but Joyce, Stanton, Nieuwenhuis and Green qualified
RF, LF- everybody listed for CF plus Baker (legacy OF1), Trumbo, Viciedo and Paulsen (when PH)
Dh - mostly Viciedo some Francisco
Some big shifts imply platoons at $1^{\text {st }}$ (Trumbo, Francisco), LF (Joyce, Baker et al). If Escobar injured with no other SS (Petit or Green) then the replacement is Kinsler qualified as an SS 8 per TBL rules and one of (Baker, Green, Petit) plays 2nd.
COMPUTER GAMERS - As the maximum shift is only ( -5 ) lefty hitters with big board shifts might stay in game with adjusted pitching grade less than 18. In critical situation (late GC down 1 or tied) always consider Paulsen for pinch hitting for batters 6 through 9 (but not for Escobar unless there is an SS8 on bench). Also, for computer gamers, with runners on $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ and adjusted pitching grade less than 13 consider having the trailing runner take an extra base on single.
