Offensive strategies: Basicly this is an easy offence to play.

The best available 9 will start all the road games. The bench has games, but limited uses.

Use of the bench

This bench has some uses, but the reality is they are on the bench because they aren't as good.

- Ramirez is primary PH, Ackley also can vs RHP; usually for Ackley vs LHP, or catcher
- Mauer can occasionallu PH for Rupp if it sets up a favorable H&R (see below)
- Essentially no SBA on the bench, but **Buxton** and **Tejada** can pinch run with an important run
- Buxton is a defensive sub in the OF, usually for Ackley

Other than that, the bench is to give guys rest, mostly at home, and in case of injury.

Hit & Run (priority over steal, sac)

The H&R options are pretty obvious. I use it extensively (i.e. almost always) when the score is +/-3 or less in innings one through 5, +/-2 in innings 6-9, +/-1 in the 9th+

- Betts at bat, H&R with Gordon on 1st
- Mauer or Ackley at bat with Machado or Correa on 1st

Mauer can H&R 1st and 3rd, Betts and Ackley do not.

Steal (priority over sac)

If H&R not available:

- Gordon can steal 2nd, 4th inning on, +/-2, adjusted SSN >= 28
- Gordon can steal 3nd, +/-1, 8th+, 0 or 1 out, Adj SSn >= 26, Trout, Davis not up
- Machado, Betts can steal 2nd, +/-1, 6th+, 1 or 2 out, Adj SSn >= 28, Trout, Davis not up
- Cordero, Trout can steal 2nd, +/-1, 7th+, 1 or 2 out, Adj SSn >= 28, Davis not up
- Steal home: 8th+, -1/0, 2 out, any runner if Adj SSN >= 16, not 3-4-5 hitters or Correa up.

Bunt

Given the weakness at the bottom of the line-up, we will adopt a *little* bit of Darryll Ball Runner on 1st, 2nd, or 1st & 2nd

+2/-1, 0 or 1 out, Mauer, Ackley, catcher can bunt. Take bunt off w/2 strikes.

X Day Off

While the offence will generally run itself, the same is not true of the pitching. This is a staff--especially the relievers--that will need some care and attention. Managing the bullpen is the hardest thing to write instructions for, so please read the intet and then do your best to apply it to the game situations.

Philosophically I will focus on winning winable games and conceeding lost causes. We aren't after stats, we are out to defend the Div title and get back in the playoffs.

I will have an uncharacteristic 7 relievers up each month.

We will always have a closer, 3 or 4 double-digit guys, and 2 or 3 long guys. 5 RHPs, 2 either LHP or Swithch Pitcher who will act as mostly as a LHRP.

We don't have enough top relief grades to get out of trouble very often--we need to try and avoid trouble as much as possible.

Using 4, 5, or 6 relievers for surically (especially the lefties) will be the norm.

If a high-grade stops a rally, and I am up 3+, I will often start the next inning with a lower grade pitcher to preserve useage--but switch to a high grade at the first sign of trouble.

Closers: Kimbrell, Sanchez If +1 to +3 they usually start the 9th.

Get out of trouble: Osuna

6th-8th: Caminero, G. Holland, Venditte

LH surgeon: D. Holland, Loup Long guys: Broxton, Bedrosian

Stops a rally, then leaves. Venditte is surgical.

Look for +5 & shifts against a couple hitters Long men when weak starters come out early. Also for games out of hand either way.

Relieve Starters:

These are guides--please over ride if game conditions make sense. I will use the good bullpen to try and win the winable games, but I will concede the lost causes and low likelyhood of success games.

89 starts of grade 10-13:

DEFENSE

Not a lot to say here.

- When he is up, Buxton is the only defensive sub on the road
- I tend to play deep for the DP unless I have a tied game or 1 run lead in the 8th or later
- I hold all runners on first unless score is +/4 (+/-3 in the 8th+ inning) or Adj SSN <20
- Use Adams tables for throws--or play as you would if you don't use Adams Tables
- I don't use the IBB a lot, but I do use it. Late in a game, 1st open, to get to a significantly weaker card or get a much better matchup.
- Pitch from the strech w/tie/win run on 3rd, 8th+ inning, Adj SSN >= 10, 1 or 2 outs
- All the little things: please used good judgement
