## Pitching

General Comments About Relief: The most difficult part of play-by-mail instructions is trying to convey precise rules for relievers. Instead, I want to give an overview, some basic philosophy, and then let you apply good, aggressive, on-site judgement. All together we have 570 innings of useable (grade 9+) innings. Be aggressive with the relievers, I will use more than the six who are up any given month. The shuttle between Brobdingnag and Lilliputia will be busy this season. Once the starter has left the game I expect to use $4+$ relievers more often than not. Generally no one pitches more than an inning, often only one or two batters. I don't care who gets saves, but Oh will likely get the most of them.

Relieving the Starters: Do not relieve a starter who is presently a grade 18+. Otherwise:
Innings 1-3: Only remove if the rules require it

## Inning 4:

If the starter is currently grade $10+:$ Remove if the score is +4 to -3 and two runners get on base
If the starter is grade 9-: Remove if the score is $+3 /-3$ and a runner gets on base
$\boldsymbol{O R}$ the score is +5 to -3 and two runners get on base
Innings 5+: Stay w/the starter if grade 18+, otherwise remove if any of the following apply:
--Starter is downgraded/fatigued and score is within $+/-5$
OR--Score is within $+4 /-3$ and a runner gets into scoring position
$\boldsymbol{O R}$--Score is within $+3 /-2$ and a runner gets on base
Inning 8+: Same as for inn 5+, but also: If I am up 1 or 2 runs and the starter is not a grade $18+$
Who to Use: Below are some roles as guidelines. Please use them along with good judgement to give my team a good chance to win.

The Closers: Oh, Kimbrell, Bedrosian, and Butcher. 3 of the 4 are up each month, 2 RH \& 1 LH . Their job is to get out of trouble, and to pitch the $9^{\text {th }}$ if I lead by 1-2 runs. They can kill 2 rallies and then they usually leave at the start of the next inning. I have no problem using all three if it takes that to win a close game. Usually the grade $20+$ will be the rally killers and Oh will close, but not necessarily. Use your best judgement about when to use the RH and LH options to get the +5 s and to inflict maximum pain.

The Set-Up RHRPs: Osuna, Harris. One or both will be active. They usually start an inning after a Closer. They can pitch until the next crisis or 2.7 IP. If you use both of these you can use the Long Reliever or the LHRP below if another Closer is not appropriate. Often one of these starts the bases-empty $8^{\text {th }}$.

The LHRPs: Claudio, Norris. Primarily LH specialists used for a few batters at tactical points.
The Long Guy: Broxton. His role is to absorb innings when the starter is gone early and/or if the game is out of hand either way (generally $+/-5$ or more). If the game gets closer, revert to the other pitchers.

## Offense

General Comments About the offense: This team has good bats top to bottom, with at least 7 legitimate hitters and power ( $250+$ HRs is likely) -but the steals are limited. Half the roster is fast, but only Betts, Trout, Ramirez, Polanco, Gordon, and Correa steal bases. We will still H\&R some, but not as much as we would like to. Generally we will use the $H \& R$ in the first part of the game, and straight steal later in the game.

We have never been a huge fan of bunting, but it has its place on this roster. If we get a lead, bring in the gloves, and then lose the lead we can have some very weak hitters who will bunt at times. Additionally, sometimes a shift penalty will argue for a bunt at times.

Innings 1-6: No bunts, only Gordon straight steals (has priority). H\&R in the following situations:
Steal: Gordon can steal $2^{\text {nd }}$ any time the score is $+3 /-3$ and adjusted SSN is 28 . No other straight steals.

## Hit \& Run:

--Score: +2/-2
--Runners: Polanco, Gordon, Betts, Correa, Trout, Ramirez
--SSN after adjustments: 24
--Hitters: Leon, Polanco, Machado, Betts, Correa

Innings 7+: Priority order is straight steal, bunt, H\&R:

## Straight Steal:

--Score: +2/-2
--Runners: Polanco, Betts, Correa, Trout, Ramirez, Gordon
--SSN after adjustments: 28
--Steal $2^{\text {nd }}$ only, no steal of $3^{\text {rd }}$ or home

## Sacrifice:

--Score: +2/-1

- -Runners: on $1^{\text {st }}$ (zero or one out), $2^{\text {nd }}$ or $1^{\text {st }} \& 2^{\text {nd }}$ (zero out)
--Hitters: Ahmed, Goins, Gordon


## Hit \& Run:

--Same as above, just lower priority

> Limits (H\&R steals \& straight steals combined):
> --1 SBA per series for Planco, Correa, Ramirez
> --2 SBA per series for Betts, Trout
> --Unlimited attempts for Gordon

This team will make a lot of substitutions, often three to five a game. Most of those will revolve around the catcher position and will occur between the $6^{\text {th }}$ and $8^{\text {th }}$ innings. These will often result in multiple moves happening between my at bat and the start of the next inning. Please look at the whole half-inning+ and make the combination of moves/batting line-up that make sense.
--Betts, Trout, Bradley, and Machado only come out for injury
--Papi/Davis only come out for a PR, tie/winning runner, $8^{\text {th }}$ inn + (see below)
--Correa only comes out for defense (Ahmed)
--Catcher \& 2 B are more complex, described below. It differs depending upon which catcher starts.
If Rupp starts: I will always PH for Rupp. Never PH for Rupp with Leon!!!!! Both catchers will be PAlimited and the intent is to stretch their plate appearances and not need Bethancourt. When Rupp comes to bat in the $6^{\text {th }}+$ inning, PH for him-usually with Davis-and bring in Leon to catch, often as part of a double or triple switch (see below). If, after I bat, I am tied or trailing, Leon comes for Davis. If, after I bat, I am leading, Davis stays in at 1B and Leon replaces Ramirez or the 2B or SS. If Ahmed and/or Goins are going to come into the game anyway, and I lead by 5 or more, use one of them to PH and stay in defensively as part of a double or triple switch.

If Leon starts: When Leon comes up to bat $6^{\text {th }}$ inning or later, I will generally do the following:
--If I lead by 1 or 2 runs leave Leon in for his throwing arm. Never PH for Leon with Rupp!!!!!!
--Otherwise PH with Davis, Ahmed, or Goins (see above) and bring in Rupp

Second base: Polanco and Drew are a platoon.
--When either comes up in the $6^{\text {th }}+$ in a meaningful AB , the other can PH if it makes sense and stay in the game
--If power is called for and Davis is not needed to PH for the catcher (i.e. Leon started and I am ahead by a little) consider him as the PH it his power is more appropriate
--If the 2 Bman hit in the home $6^{\text {th }}$ or later and I lead by $3+$, bring Goins in to start the $7^{\text {th }}$
--If I lead by any amount starting in the $8^{\text {th }}+$, bring in Goins regardless of whether the 2 Bman hit or nor.
Shortstop: No pinch hitting needed here, but:
--If Correa hit in the home $6^{\text {th }}$ or later and I lead by 3+, bring Ahmed in to start the $7^{\text {th }}$
--If I lead by any amount starting in the $8^{\text {th }}+$, bring in Ahmed

Pinch Running: About the only other sub I will typically use is to pinch run:
--In the $8^{\text {th }}+$ inning for Ortiz if the score is $+1 /$ tied $/-1$
--In the $9^{\text {th }}+$ inning for Davis if I trail by 1 run
A faster starting pitcher, Ahmed, or Goins are the most likely-the starting pitcher preferred unless I am up one run (i.e for Ortiz) and Ahmed/Goins will come in at the top of the $9^{\text {th }}$ inning anyway.

[^0]:    I have tried to explain what I am looking to do, but, these moves will often occur in the same half inning, so please look at what makes sense where you make the defensive switches if I lead. The ideal infield when I lead late is Davis-Goins-Ahmed-Machado with Leon catching.
