GENERAL PHILOSOPHY:

The Statesmen are 'In It to Win It' this year. Ownership considers every game to be winnable and has asked team management and players to approach the season with that mind set. The offense will score their fair share of runs & the pitching is solid & deep.

SPECIAL GUIDANCE

- 1) The 2018 Statesmen are an Earl Weaver rather than Tony LaRussa type club. Power will rule the year.
- 2) GRANDAL gets no more than 3 Plate Appearances (PA's) per game.
- 3) COZART and MURPHY get no more than 3 PA's if winning, 4 if tied or losing.
- 4) All players are available off the bench but please use the better 'cards' in key situations only.

STRATEGY BY POSITION AND DEFENSIVE REPLACEMENTS

<u>CATCHER</u>: Grandal starts and gets no more than 3 PA's per game so pinch hit for him at his 4th PA. He may only get 2 PA if a double switch is employed prior to his 3rd PA. Mathis then enters the game defensively. Try to not use Grandal off the bench if at all possible.

FIRST BASE: Mauer most every day with Lind filling in. Mauer in defensively in the 7th or later if STM ahead by 2 or less.

SECOND BASE: *Murphy starts and gets no more than 3 PA's if winning, 4 if tied or losing.* Amarista comes in defensively when Murphy hits his PA limit, OR, from 7th inning on with STM ahead by any number of runs.

THIRD BASE: Arenado every day.

<u>SHORTSTOP:</u> *Cozart starts and gets no more than 3 PA's if winning, 4 if tied or losing.* Hechavarria comes in defensively when Cozart hits his PA limit, OR, from 7th inning on, with STM ahead by any number of runs.

<u>OUTFIELD:</u> Upton, Peralta, Davis are primary with Lind and Hamilton starting games here and there throughout the season. Hamilton comes in defensively for Davis or Lind, 7th inning on, with STM ahead. Look to use Hamilton in double switch if he runs for the catcher or Lind earlier in game. *DO NOT use Upton as a defensive replacement.*

DESIGNATED HITTER: Cruz every day.

DOUBLE SWITCHES: Please keep an eye on this. In the home 7th, make the following defensive changes if STM ahead: Hamilton in OF, Amarista at 2B, Hechavarria at SS, and Mathis for Grandal. Mauer in to 1B if STM ahead by 2 or less.

OFFENSIVE STRATEGY

HIT & RUN: Strategy #1

- 1) Amarista, Hechavarria, Lind, Mauer, and Peralta can H & R:
 - a. with a runner on 1st who has an adjusted SSN of 20 or more AND is NOT slow, OR
 - b. with 2 outs. (Computer players see 3) below)
- 2) Mauer is the only batter to H & R with runners on 1st & 3rd.
- 3) Computer game Only H & R with 2 outs if Hamilton, Peralta, or Upton are on 1st.

STEAL: Strategy #2

- 1) Hamilton steal attempts become the #1 strategy over the Hit & Run if he is the tying or lead run.
- 2) Hamilton steals second after the 2nd, third after the 5th, and home in 9th or later when eligible by Adams Tables.
- 3) Peralta and Upton have green light to steal 2nd (if no H & R to be executed) or 3rd, 7th inning or later, if they are the tying or lead run and eligible by Adams Tables.

SACRIFICE: Strategy #3

- 1) Amarista, Hamilton, and Mathis will sacrifice with the tying or lead run on 2^{nd} , OR 1^{st} and 2^{nd} , with 0 out from the 6th inning on.
- 2) NEVER squeeze.

PINCH HITTING:

1) Hit for Grandal at his 4th PA with Lind or best situational card on bench. Mathis then in to catcher.

PINCH RUNNING:

1) Pinch-run for Cozart, Cruz, Davis, Grandal, Lind, or Murphy, 7th inning or later, STM tied to -2. Use Hamilton (if stealing is best), Amarista, or Hechavarria. Consider the possibility of double switches that keep Amarista at 2B, Hamilton in the OF, or Hechavarria at SS depending on who pinch runs and score of the game.

RUNNER ADVANCEMENT:

- 1) Always go if chance is 28+ for home and 32+ for 3B. Otherwise, use Adams Tables.
- 2) Computer game use the standards for advancement that you use for your team.

SEND RUNNER ON 3RD: If your infield is in, HOLD runner unless combined fielding rating of your 2B & SS is < 15.

DEFENSIVE STRATEGY

HOLD RUNNER: When 1B4 is playing first always hold. Otherwise:

- 1) Hold all fast runners.
- 2) Hold all medium runners unless I have a lead of 2 or more and there is a PR hitter.
- 3) Hold slow runners only with a RH hitter or less than 2 out unless I lead by 2 or more.
- 4) Don't hold with 2 out & men on 1st & 3rd unless runner on 1st is the tying/lead run or a steal threat.

INFIELD IN: Three instances:

- 1) Runner on 3rd only: 0 or 1 out, 6^{th} inning or later, STM +1 to -2.
- 2) Runners on 1st and 3rd: 8^{th} inning or later, 0 out, STM +1 to -2.
- 3) 2nd & 3rd OR Bases Full: only if winning run on 3rd, 9th inning or later, 0 or 1 out.

EXCEPTION – with 1 out, Bases Full, play deep if batter has 3 or more 24s.

OUTFIELD THROWS:

- 1) Throw for lead runner if < 33 chances otherwise hold trailing runners.
- 2) In 6th inning or later, hold trailing runner if they are tying run UNLESS lead runner has <16 chances.
- 3) Computer game use standards for throws that you use for your team, BUT, don't try for lead runner if:
 - a. runner is "well around" & not slow OR
 - b. trailing runner is tying run from the 7th inning on.

INTENTIONAL WALKS: If lead run is in scoring position after 4th inning & 1B open, issue free pass with:

- 1) 1 out to set up the double play unless on-deck hitter is superior to player to be walked.
- 2) 2 out to get to a much more inferior hitter.
- 3) NEVER walk the bases full unless the ensuing hitter/pitcher match-up is favorable and makes a walk highly unlikely.

<u>PITCH FROM THE STRETCH:</u> Runner on 3^{rd} , 8^{th} inning or later, 2 outs, STM +1 to tied, and adjusted SSN > 10.

MANAGING THE PITCHING STAFF

OVERALL: Anytime the starters can give the club 6+ innings is a bonus but don't leave a starter in just to get to 6 innings. Do not let Feldman get buried. Have a quicker hook for him since he will have a caddy to spell him early.

STARTERS:

- 1) should not pitch over 11.7 innings per start unless they have an extra day of rest in the schedule & are currently at grade 20.
- 2) should be removed in any inning when reduced in grade due to earned runs or fatigue unless STM +5 or more; if they are reduced in grade a second time remove them immediately no matter the inning, situation, or score.
- 3) less than grade 20 should be removed if STM lead by less than 4 runs at the start of any inning from the 8th on.
- 4) Beyond the guidance above, other starting pitcher removal strategies, by inning, are:

<u>INNING</u> :	SITUATION FOR REMOVAL OF STARTER:
<u>1st - 5th</u> :	Surrendered 5 earned runs (with a grade reduction) or 6 total runs, score STM +4 to -4
6th & 7th:	Surrendered a run OR a runner gets into scoring position and score STM +3 to -3
<u>8th</u> :	Surrendered a run OR a runner gets on and score STM +3 to -3
<u>9th +</u> :	Surrendered a run OR a runner gets on and score STM +3 to -2

BULLPEN: We will have 6 relievers up each month. Below is how I see them being used **BUT** you are always right to do what your baseball instincts tell you to do in any given situation to help the STM win. It is well within my philosophy to utilize multiple relievers in each game in order to maximize opportunities for a win. In a blowout for either team, share the load between the entire bullpen if needed. No one should ever, unless an extra inning game occurs, pitch over 2.7 IP per game.

MILLER (62.7 RIP): Closer. Can come in for the final out in the 8th if best for the team. If you tie the game, remove him at the end of the inning. Can be fatigued once and still pitch if needed.

<u>CISHEK (44.7 RIP), EDWARDS (66.3 RIP), and MADSON (59.0 RIP)</u>: 6th through 8th inning set-up men that link to Miller. They are basically interchangeable but each have strengths/weaknesses. Cishek has decent peripherals and grade. Edwards has the better grade but is best served to start an inning or come in with bases empty due to his -62 CTL. Madson has less grade than the others but great peripherals who should probably face the meat of your order to try and stop those pesky game changing BB's and HR's. <u>Cishek is only up for 4 months of the season so use him a little bit more than the other two when he is available.</u>

<u>COMPUTER PLAYERS</u> – Edwards, if available, should always be the link to Miller. Cishek and Madson should pitch prior to Edwards and Miller.

SWARZAK (77.3 RIP) and ROSENTHAL (47.7 RIP): One or both are up every month with Swarzak up primarily against division foes. They can pitch anytime from the 4th inning on to put down rallies before you get too much momentum or hold our lead. If both of them are up in the same month then Rosenthal is also serving as Feldman or Bibens-Dirkx caddy.

JENNINGS (62.7 RIP): Pitches in the mid to late game primarily against, but not limited to, your bad lefty shifts. He has a decent amount of innings so he is more than a LOOGY. Can pitch early if needed.

MARINEZ (58.3 RIP) and YACABONIS (20.7): Feldman or Bibens-Dirkx caddies (along with Rosenthal a few times during season).
