3. Pinch Hitting - All players will be limited by PA so just about anybody can be used off the bench in a close game late when it matters. However, I would prefer not to ph with Pham or Jankowsky as they will use more PA batting early in the lineup.
4. Pinch Runner - for slow $8^{\text {th }}$ on, when game on line. For the steal Dyson if available or Kinsler (who can stay in for defense) or Escobar. Not so good at stealing but fast, Pirela (if up) or Adames. Prefer not to use Jankowsky this way.
5. Defensive Substitutes - Zimmerman to $1^{\text {st }}$, Kinsler to $2^{\text {nd }}$, Escobar to SS, Gyorko to $3^{\text {rd }}$, Lucroy to C, and no OF1 in the outfield.
6. Sacrifice; Any player not having a first column " 1 " on 66 - with bad shifts, to keep them in game, will sac on no out, man on second or 1st and 2nd, pitcher "B" or better, score close, late. Ditto for man on first, steal not recommended (especially if adjusted pitching grade over 18). Squeeze bunt - ONLY with runners on 3rd, or 2nd and 3rd, 8th or later, score within 1, fast runner. Batter with less than 5-13's
7. Stealing 2nd: Dyson, Escobar, Janowsky, Kinsler, Pham or Pirela after 5th inning adjusted SSN over 24. Same (less Escobar and Pirela) could try to steal 3rd or home when it makes sense. Stanton or Carpenter can try to steal $2^{\text {nd }}$ in the $8^{\text {th }}$ inning or later.
8. Hit and Run - Dyson, Gyorko, Jankowsky, Kinsler, Lucroy and Pirela will H\&R with man on first (any number of outs), or men on first and third with 0 or 2 outs. But only if runner on first listed under steals (excluding Carpenter and Stanton).
9. Intentional Walk: If score not close late, big hitter can walk in front of whimp on 2 out, but don't put tying/winning run on base.
10. Pitch from Stretch: On 2 out, for adjusted SSN to steal home of 12 or more; on less than 2 out, with adjusted SSN of 15 or more (or 12 if pitcher grade 20 or more).
11. Hold runner: For 1B2 never! All others - always on none or 1 out; also on 2 out unless runner won't steal.
12. Infield deep before 6th, on 2 out, if score difference 3 or more, if man on 1 st too. Otherwise play in.
13. Offensive runner advancement: By Adams tables. For computer game, when obvious (runner well around bag, or on single to right with runners on $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ and pitcher allows 8 's). Consider runner's speed.
14. Outfield throws: Never if runner has $33 / 36$ or better chance of safe advance (unless this scores winning run), cutoff automatic, trailing runners hold. Otherwise throw.
15. Injuries: Your judgment but see next page. Call: (978)-687-2124 for lineup if needed, just do your best. 18. Send runner on 3rd: On 2 out, your infield deep, or your defense below average (sum of $2 \mathrm{nd}+\mathrm{SS}+3 \mathrm{rd}$ basemen less than 19).
16. Defense against multiple steals: Pitch from stretch as appropriate. Hold ball and free steal of 2nd (no steal of home) for men on 1st and 3rd (unless \#12 applies); for runners on 1st and 2nd go for lowest SSN.

STARTERS ARE NEVER EVER TO BE USED IN RELIEF (or more than 11.2 IP per start). Six or seven relievers are normally active, see active list and check email for limit on innings later in year. Starters leave when fatigued but protect leads after 5 th. Better pitchers should make it to $7^{\text {th }}$. If behind by 3 or more starters may stay until pounded out but leave if GC makes comeback. S. Wright starts last series (as a 16) fatigue of 20 but might be replaced if he runs out of innings. S. Wright may be out of lineup some months, see road instructions.

## GOTHAM CITY PHILOSPHY THIS YEAR

This team will be about .500 with a possible (?) shot for a wild card position. I will maximize lineups when I face my division. A few players have really bad shifts (on boards) so we will play more people for plate appearances and substitute more freely.

In Case of Injury, use this table - keep defense up.
C - Chirinos (C7) and Lucroy (C8) and they can substitute for each other.
$1 b$-Carpenter, Canha, Vogelbach or Pirela (1B3) or Zimmerman (1B4). Try not to use any 1B2.
2b - Mostly Kinsler (2B9), or Adames, Pirela (2B7) try to avoid 2B6
SS - Mostly Escobar (SS8), some Adames (SS7) try to avoid Gyorko (SS6).
3b - Gyorko (3B4), Carpenter (3B3). If down a lot consider Pirela (3B3).
CF - Jankowsky, Dyson, Pham and Canha qualified.
RF, LF- everybody listed for CF plus Stanton, Pirela.
Dh - mostly Choi, Carpenter or Vogelbach.
COMPUTER GAMERS - The lineup for computer managers will be special as some players have reverse shifts - SA0 on computer. As the maximum shift is only $(-5)$ lefty hitters with big board shifts might stay in game with adjusted pitching grade less than 18 . Also, for computer gamers, with runners on $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ and adjusted pitching grade less than 13 consider having the trailing runner take an extra base on single.
