Notes: I will contact road managers by e-mail each month to give individualized lineups or the go-ahead to use the above lineups. **Very seldom will these lineups be used, though**. The chart showing those in the minors each month is included on the roster sheet, but no doubt will be revised, especially later in the year. Please contact me if you'd like to start early and I'll try to accommodate.

Player Usage:

C: Yan Gomes (105 g. of C-8, +5) is the primary catcher with Jesus Sucre (C-8, +1) there for the remaining games or when Gomes is PH for. Only 185 g. and 633 PA's between the two, so will require diligent oversight.

1B: Justin Smoak (147 g, of 1B-5) will be the regular first baseman, with Mark Reynolds supplying the other 15 starts.

2B: Kike Hernandez (145 g. of 2B-7) will give the Koyotes a new look second baseman while **Dustin Pedroia** sits out the year after potentially career ending knee surgery. Third round draftee, **Jose Rondon**, will play the remaining 17 games, although **Chris Taylor** may be seen there on occasion. Both are ugly 2b-6's.

SS: Jean Segura will be the fulltime SS (144 g.). Taylor (SS-7) will be found there in the other 18 games.

3B: Mike Moustakas (152 g.) is the everyday 3B again with Rondon filling out the other 10..

OF: All three "regular" OF'ers are shy of fulltime status - Taylor, after filling in at SS will have about 135 g. left. George Springer (140 g.) & Yasiel Puig (125 g.) are the other two. Curtis Granderson will fill out the remaining games, playing vs. RHP's. Jose Osuna or Reynolds with their OF-1's may occasionally be found there.

DH: Granderson, Reynolds, Rondon, Osuna & 6th round draftee, Johnny Field, will be mix & match DH'ers.

Defensive Replacements:

Fairly good defensive starting lineup and not much available on the bench, so no defensive subs at this point.

Offense:

Pinch Hit/Run: PH for Sucre in the 8th or 9th if PH represents the tying or winning run. Use best OF/DH type available (Granderson, Osuna, Reynolds, Field, etc.).

Steal Attempts: Only two real threats to steal (Segura & Puig) with two additional occasionally (Taylor & Springer). The former will have the green light to steal 2nd in the 9th if the game is tied or Koyotes are down 1 and adjusted SSN is 25+. There are a few others with decent SSN's who will get their steal attempts later in the year or at home.

Hit & Run: H&R anytime allowed with Segura on 1st & Puig or Springer up, Koyotes tied or within two runs either way. Steal instructions take precedence over the H&R's. Any other options will be spelled out in the monthly instructions.

Sacrifice: very rare. Never squeeze!

Offensive Runner Advancement:

Board Game: Consult Adams Table.

Computer Game: always send runners who are "well around third", hold runners who are "rounding third", unless a Fast runner and OF arm <31. Be conservative going for third, more aggressive going home, especially with two outs. General Rule for computer: be aggressive with Fast runners and conservative with Slow runners. Also on the computer, if a batter gets an extra base hit and "hits second base with a full head of steam" do not consider going for

Send Runner on Third: With infield in, hold runner if combined 2b/3b/ss fielding rating >18. Any lesser combination, or runners on first and third, Go Go Go!

Outfield Throws: Make all throws <34 chances. Otherwise hold trailing runners. Throw for trailing runners attempting advancement if lead runner is not tie/lead run and trailer is 10+ chances lower.

Computer Game: Make all throws. If you try to advance a trailing runner along with a runner "well around third" cut the throw home and go for the trailer.

Hold Runner on First: For all 1B's hold runner if SSN >24 or a PL batter at bat. Otherwise let 'em roam.

Intentional Walk: Only in extra innings and game tied, first base open, one out, to set up DP, lesser hitter due up. **Pitch from Stretch:** Only pitch from stretch if 2 outs, 8 inning on, tying or winning runner on third base has an adjusted SSN > 9.

Infield In/Deep: Never play in with two outs or before the 7 inning. Only play infield in if the tying/winning run is on third base, 7 inning on and less than two outs. If the double play is a possibility, always play deep.

For computer managers, when in doubt about any of these computer instructions, play it as you would your own team - I'm admittedly ignorant about the computer game (and intend to stay that way!)

Pitching:

General Philosophy: The rotation will only need 6 starters this year to cover the 162 starts, but there will be a significant dropoff from last year's playoff team staff. Koyotes will again be headed up by Max Scherzer with 33 starts of gr. 16. He is backed by a couple of decent starters, Luis Severino (32 starts of gr. 11) and C.C. Sabathia (29/10), Dallas Keuchel will provide 34 gr. 8 starts. Unfortunately that leaves 34 starts to be handled by mediocre grades – Sonny Gray (gr. 6 – 22 starts) and Brett Anderson (gr. 5 – 12 starts). The latter two will sometimes get an early hook, but more often be allowed to be pounded.

A lights out closer in **Jose LeClerc** (gr. 29) and one decent 8th inning guy in **Brad Hand**.(gr. 16), so late inning leads should be OK. After that it gets pretty dicey. Grade 12's, Joakim Soria and Adam Warren are decent and both will be available most months. One of the wildmen, **Neil Ramirez** (11) and **Chasen Shreve** (10), will always be active (and will often pour fuel on fires). Three grade 9's, **Luis Avilan, Hector Velazquez & Matt Bush** round out the usable relief with two being available every month. That leaves **Ken Giles** (gr. 5) and **Matt Harvey** (gr. 4) to mop up lost causes. The general rule will be to allow the starters to go till fatigued, as there are only 242 RIP of gr. 12 and above. Gray and Anderson will often be asked to take one for the team and be pounded.

No starter should pitch more than 11.2 innings. Don't remove any starting pitcher if he's pitching a shutout before that.

Starting Pitchers Bio's:

Scherzer - The ace at gr. 16 - should go deep in most starts

Severino, Sabathia - The other decent (gr. 11 and 10) starters.

Keuchel – Some days a diamond, some days a stone (gr. 8)

Gray, Anderson – 34 mediocre grade 5 and 6 starts, will get the hook early fairly often, but could be allowed to be pounded occasionally to save the bullpen innings.

Bullpen: With 34 mediocre starts and only 460 RIP of grade 9+ and only 242 of those grade 12+, the pen will require diligent management. Seven relievers will always be on the active roster. The roster will be managed so that regardless of RIP allowable, all non-closer relievers can be used equally in any particular month as need be.

Bullpen Bio's:

LeClerc: The closer, and with 57.7 RIP can be used in most of the save situations. Discretion will be used as the season goes on in 3 run lead 9th inning situations to conserve innings if necessary. He won't go more than one inning unless the Koyotes take a lead in the 10th.

Hand: Eighth inning man when Koyotes are up 1 or 2. Will also be used as the closer at times.

Soria, Warren: Primary seventh inning options in close games.

Ramirez: RH with bad peripherals, but it is what it is for those middle inning stints.

Shreve: One of the two LH relievers in the pen (other than Hand) – but will often need to go more than one batter.

Avilan: The other LH'er – will be used for up to an inning when LH batters are expected.

Velazquez: Good peripherals – will use his starting innings at the reduced rate and no upgrade when RIP exhausted.

Bush: Only 23 innings of grade 9 wildness, **Giles, Harvey, Araujo:** The mop up trio.

Grade 9's and 10's will try to get game to 7th inning in close games, but will often have to eat up innings if starter is fatigued or "pounded". All of them are basically interchangeable – pay attention to the LH/RH matchups and times when the bad peripherals are more problematic.

Araujo added after waiver draft – will probably only be used in November as mopup if needed.

Summary: In 2018, the Koyotes won 102 games, the most under current management, the most since 2004, and third most in franchise history. But all that fell short of the World Series goal, even after trading away their first two 2019 draft choices in the futile effort, thanks to the 112 win Strong City Statesmen,. This year's version has no such expectations – a .500 season would be considered a success. But with an ever-optimistic attitude and never in the "tear down" mode, we will try to milk out as many wins as possible.

The defense (outside of Hernandez' 2B-7) is decent. Justin Smoak (1B-5) and Mike Moustakas (3B-5) will supply excellent defense at the corners. Both catchers are C-8's with plus arms. Puig's 38 rifle arm and the OF-3's of Puig and Springer supply excellent OF defense. A September trade acquired Brad Hand, a needed bullpen arm, as the rest of the pen is fairly marginal.

If you have any questions, use your best baseball judgment and do whatever gives Kansas the best chance at a win. We are looking to have fun, even though anything more than a .500 season will be considered a success.
