## Midwest on Offense

Bunt: Yep, we still like it. You should bunt any time the leadoff batter is on 2B, UNLESS the batter is Rosario. The power is down this year, so if a runner reaches first in the fifth inning or later, you can also look to bunt. It is a good hit and run team, however, so look first to do that.

Hit and Run: I like this play a bunch. If an eligible runner is on first and the game is $+/-$ two runs, hit and run with Gurriel, Hosmer, Jones, Martinez, Mauer, Nunez, Odor, Rosario, Smith, Turner at bat. Try to H-R two to three times a game, but not with runners on first and third.

Stolen Base: Turner can straight steal starting in the fifth inning if the score is tied and he gets on base. Bellinger and Rosario can straight steal in a tie game in the ninth inning or later. Victor Reyes is on the bench for his base running ability and can pinch run for any of the catchers or Martinez if one of them gets on base $7^{\text {th }}$ inning or later in a tie game.

Runner Advancement and Throws: Use the chart for advancing on the bases, and throw to bases as you would for your own team. I trust your judgment. Do not be afraid to be aggressive and possibly lose base runners; I like my runners to try for an extra base in a close game if their success rate is 41 or higher. The only runners who should play station to station are the catchers and the aged Victor Martinez. In computer play, don't advance if the runner is not well around the base, and do not take extra bases on balls to left field.

Infield In: Since I have a better defense this year, we can be a little more aggressive here. In the sixth inning or later, in a game that is $+/-2$ runs, pull the infield in with runners on third, second and third, or first and third with 0 or 1 outs. If my pitcher has good control peripherals, feel free to walk your hitter in that situation to set up a double play; if bases are loaded and it is 0 out situation, play in even then; with one out, play back for the DP in that situation.

Hold Runners/Stretch: Do not hold with LH batters at the plate. You can hold against right handed batters, but if the runner is not a stolen base threat, don't hold-your judgment there is fine. Always stretch with runners on base.

Everything else is your judgment. Play my team as you would yours. Within the restrictions listed above, play to win today's game. The bench is small, but it is useful. The backup catchers are good defensively and should replace Mauer in the seventh inning or later when the Dawgs lead. Nunez/Odor can be seen as a platoon at 2B, and late in the games, one can pinch hit for the other to get a split advantage. Martinez can hit for Leon or Holaday when there are three catchers on the roster for any given month, and then one of the remaining catchers can enter the game to finish up. I will put seriesspecific substitution suggestions with the lineups for our individual series.

## Midwest Pitching

The Dawgs have three viable starters (Berrios, Bumgarner, Gonzalez) and then are playing a variation of the opener game with the rest of the starters. They are good enough that they COULD go five innings and earn some wins, but they are all flawed, so the rules and the chart should be followed always when they start games. With Berrios, Bumgarner, and Gonzalez, play the game straight up and try to extend them into the sixth or seventh if they are pitching well and I have a chance to win. Some general guidelines:

- Berrios, Bumgarner can stay in the game when fatigued if Dawgs lead.
- If they are fatigued again or tying run gets on base, they leave immediately
- Use valet chart for Bettis, Covey, Davies, Kuhl, Skoglund
- And of course, if starters are pitching a shutout, they stay in the game until that changes.
- Never, ever let the weak starters stay in the game to take a pounding. I want rallies stopped early as noted in the valet chart-that is my best bet to get to the back end of the pen and win games-so be aggressive in your use of the valet system


## Starter Valet System and Reliever Roles

The starters in the chart are all the weak links on this team. What I want to prevent is an early blowout situation as they start. Each of these starters is capable of throwing five good innings from time to time to turn things over to the bullpen for the final four innings. BUT they are more likely to pour gasoline on an early fire due either to a low grade, bad control, or a high homerun rating. Your job is to try to staunch the bleeding EARLY. So please follow these rules.

1) These pitchers stay in the game in the first inning unless they give up three runs. If that happens, they get the quick hook in the first and then use Valets 1 and 2 for up to 2 innings each as long as they are not fatigued.
2) If they make it through the first inning unscored upon, same idea for inning number two. Same usage of valets.
3) If they are still unscored upon after getting through the first two innings, the same removal rule follows in the third and again in the fourth innings. If they are removed in the third, use Valet \#1; if they are removed in the fourth, use Valet \#2 instead.
4) If they are still unscored upon in the fifth inning, same removal rule, but go right to the regular rotation of middle, late, and closing pitchers to try to preserve a lead and take a win.
5) The three run rule is cumulative-if one run scores in the first and two score in the third, remove the starter. ANY combination that adds up to three brings the hook. At this point in the season, this is an ALWAYS command. I will monitor and adjust as needed based on how things go in the opening months.
6) The artsy part of this-what if the three runs have not scored, but a big hit could score three or four to add to what has already been plated. In that case, go to the valet BEFORE the big hit comes to try to stop it from occurring. Your call, and I won't be upset if you guess wrong, but if you ARE guessing, put the valet in.
