## OFFENSIVE STRATEGY

## HIT \& RUN: Strategy \#1 (Mondesi steal attempts become the \#1 strategy over the Hit \& Run)

1) Frazier, Murphy \& Newman with a runner on 1st ONLY who has an adjusted SSN of 20 or more \& is NOT slow,
2) Guerrero \& Pujols with any eligible runner on 1 st \& less than 2 outs,
3) Do not use with runners on 1st \& 3rd,
4) Computer game -H \& R with 2 outs ONLY IF Garcia, Mondesi, or Newman are on 1st.

## STEAL: Strategy \#2

1) Mondesi can steal 2nd after the second, 3rd after the fourth, and home in seventh or later when eligible by Adams Tables.
2) Garcia \& Newman can steal 2nd base (if no H \& R to be executed) or 3rd base from the 5th inning on if score STM +1 to $-1 \&$ can steal home in 8th or later if lead run, 2 outs. All scenarios only when eligible by Adams Tables.

## SACRIFICE: Strategy \#3

1) Do not use this strategy this season.

## PINCH HITTING / RUNNING:

1) See Strategy/Roles Chart above - note that Norris can be used if on the roster and out of other options

## RUNNER ADVANCEMENT:

1) Always go if chance is $28+$ for home and $32+$ for $3 B$. Otherwise, use Adams Tables.
2) Computer game - use the standards for advancement that you use for your team.

## SEND RUNNER ON 3RD:

1) If your infield is in, HOLD runner unless combined fielding rating of your 2 B \& SS is $<15$.

DEFENSIVE STRATEGY

## HOLD / DON'T HOLD RUNNER:

1) hold all fast runners,
2) hold all medium \& slow runners unless I have a lead of 2 or more \& PR hitter up,
3) don't hold with 2 out \& men on 1st \& 3rd unless runner on 1 st is the tying/lead run or a steal threat.

## INFIELD IN:

1) Runner on 3rd only: 0 or 1 out, 4th inning or later, STM +1 to -2 ,
2) Runners on 1 st and 3rd: 6 th inning or later, 0 out, STM +1 to -2 ,
3) 2nd \& 3rd OR Bases Full: only if winning run on 3rd, 9th inning or later, 0 or 1 out.

EXCEPTION - with 1 out, Bases Full, play deep if batter has 3 or more 24s.

## OUTFIELD THROWS:

1) Throw for lead runner if $<33$ chances otherwise hold trailing runners.
2) In 6th inning or later, hold trailing runner if they are tying run UNLESS lead runner has $<16$ chances.
3) Computer game - use standards for throws that you use for your team.

INTENTIONAL WALKS: If lead run is in scoring position after 4th inning \& 1B open, issue free pass with:

1) 1 out - to set up the double play unless on-deck hitter is superior to player to be walked.
2) 2 out - to get to a much more inferior hitter.
3) NEVER walk the bases full.

PITCH FROM THE STRETCH: Runner on 3rd, 6th inning or later, 2 outs, STM +1 to -1 , and adjusted SSN $>10$.

## MANAGING THE PITCHING STAFF

STARTERS: When a grade $13+$ starter is in the game, give them a little more leeway in staying in the game even if downgraded by fatigue. With them, follow more of the game situation and your instincts on whether they can get 1 or 2 more batters out rather than the following the hard guidelines which are:

1) Starters should NOT be removed
a. before the 5th unless fatigued or pounded out, OR
b. if they are Gr13+ AND are pitching a shutout (UNLESS \#2d below occurs).
2) Starters should be removed
a. after 11.7 innings pitched, OR
b. in 5th if they fatigue, surrender a run, or allow a runner to get into scoring position, STM +2 to $-2, \mathrm{OR}$
c. from the 6th on if they fatigue, surrender a run, or runner gets on base, STM +3 to $-3,0 \mathrm{R}$
d. if they are less than Grade 20 and the tying run reaches from the 8th on.

## BULLPEN:

We will only have 5 relievers up each month which is crazy, right? I will be substituting with fresh arms each month in order to minimize the heavy usage potential.

I know you will do a great job in handling the relievers - just think back to the 80 's.
Lefties are more than LOOGY-type pitchers BUT can be used that way if the situation warrants.
In a blowout for either team, balance the load across the pen (minus the closers - Hicks \& Pomeranz).
Hicks and Pomeranz should never pitch over 1.0 IP per game.
Perdomo can go up to 2.7 IP per game while the remaining should stay closer to 2.0 IP per game.
The Statesmen have gone back to the boards after a season on the computer. I will send out specific instructions for each road series. Please do not use a computer manager for me. Also, please send BOTH teams'stats for ALL away series.
